



USEPA Region 6 Enforcement Officer Receives Lifetime Achievement Award from the Alliance of Hazardous Materials Managers (AHMP)

Diana Lundelius, CHMM, Senior Enforcement Officer in the Chemical Accident Enforcement Section at USEPA Region 6 in Dallas, was the recipient of the 2019 AHMP Pete Cook Founder's Award for lifetime achievement. She is the first EPA staff professional scientist to receive this award, which was presented at the AHMP National Conference on Tuesday August 27, 2019. This award is AHMP's highest honor, and is given to an AHMP Member for outstanding career-long accomplishments in the environmental, health and safety profession, and for support of the integrity of professional certification credentials. Diana was previously named a Fellow of the Institute of Hazardous Materials Management (IHMM), in October 2013. Diana became a CHMM in 1999, and was introduced to the credential by her husband of 22 years, David A. Wilson, CHMM, CIH. Among her many accomplishments during her 40-year career, she was the DFW Chapter Secretary for 20 years, from 2000-2019, and national conference chair in 2003 when the AHMP (then ACHMM) conference was held in Dallas. During that year, the conference exhibit hall completely sold out (103 exhibits). Diana has also been a chapter author and peer reviewer for the IHMM textbook, Managing Hazardous Materials, the AHMP Desk Reference, and various AHMP newsletter articles, and she suggested the theme and moderated the panel discussion for the IHMM 30th anniversary symposium, "The Pillars of Change", at the 2014 AHMP Conference. She has recently served on the IHMM Recertification Committee from September 2018 to June 2020, and is currently the Chair of the IHMM Hazardous Materials Society (HMS) Education & Training Committee.
